Using dictionaries we will order names of food alphabetically and match definitions to the words.

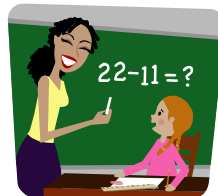
As always phonics and reading are very important. Please continue to read with your child daily and help them to learn their sounds.

How can we collect and sort information? The children will learn how to use lists, tables and charts during maths sessions as well as producing charts and graphs using a variety of ICT programs.

The children will be looking at the measures of length, weight and capacity. They will make direct comparisons and measure to find the answers to questions.

What's the time Mr Wolf? and The Very Hungry Caterpillar stories will provide a starting point for the children to learn about telling the time on a clock, the days of the week and the months of the year.
