#### **Christmas Fayre**

This year the Christmas Fayre is focusing on fun and games for all the children at Archibald! We are conscious that family life can be super busy during December and a lot of children attend clubs and activities in the evening, so we have decided to hold the fayre during the school day on Thursday 8 and Friday 9 December. This is how the Christmas Fayre was run last year; it worked well, and the children had a great time. Our intention is that nobody will miss out on the experience.

One of the stalls will be a chocolate tombola (It's VERY popular!) but we need your help to make it possible. Mrs Turner has agreed that **on Friday 25 November children can come to school in non-school uniform, in exchange for a voluntary chocolate donation!** Just something small that costs no more than £1. All chocolate donations will be used to stock the tombola so that all children will have the chance to win something when they visit the fayre.

On the day that your child will be attending the fayre, we would be grateful if you could send them to school with a loose change donation; perhaps for the amount you would give them to spend if they were attending a school fayre with you. Donations will be exchanged for tokens to spend on activities at the fayre. Please note, no money will be used in the fayre and all children will receive the same number of tokens, regardless of how much money you donate. The donation is voluntary - all children will be able to attend the fayre.

Everyone will visit the fayre with their class and will have the opportunity to choose which games and stalls they want to visit. There won't be any stalls selling items to bring home. The fayre is for the children to attend without parents/carers and children will be supported to participate. Years 1-4 will be supervised by teaching staff. Reception children will buddy-up with children from years 3 and 4, who will guide them around the activities and help them with anything that involves writing. Games will be run by parents and friends of the school, volunteering their time.

We are all really looking forward to the Christmas Fayre and would like to thank you all in advance for helping us make it happen.

## An easy way to raise funds

Easyfundraising is an online platform (website and app) that allows you to raise money for a cause of your choice, just by doing your online shopping!

Once you've registered, you can set up a donation reminder. This means that whenever you access a shopping website from your phone (a similar reminder can be set up for computers) a reminder will pop up if a donation is available.

Most of the big stores like John Lewis, Marks & Spencer etc will donate up to 3% of what you spend. The small amounts all add up. In just three weeks, someone has raised £12.80.

It's surprising which on-line shops give donations. One of our volunteers got £2.17 from buying a new tap, and regularly gets £1.50 for each weekly on-line Sainsbury's delivery.
