School Uniform and Shoes



Please remember that full school uniform including plain, dark school shoes must be worn when it is not a PE day.

Now it is summer, red gingham dresses can be worn too.

On PE days, the school PE kit of plain royal blue shorts

and a plain red t-shirt may be worn with a school jumper.

Trainers may ONLY be worn on PE days and no other sports kit is appropriate for school.

If you have an after-school PE club (and do not have PE that day), please come to school in uniform and **<u>change into school PE kit</u>** at the start of the club

Sandals

<u>Plain blue, black, white or red sandals</u> may be worn as long as:

- They are flat
- Fasten securely
- Are worn with socks to protect toes.

Crocs, flip flops, slip on and heels cannot be worn!

Growing feet

If children grow out of their school shoes over the next 6 weeks, consider a part of sandals for them to see them through until the end of term. This will save buying new school shoes before September.

Uniform Exchange

Our uniform exchange boxes are quite full!

If you do need some new uniform for this half term for the next school year OR at any time during the year, please just come in and speak to the school office.

It all needs a good home and is as good as new.

There will be a donation tin which you can add anything you feel able to give. This will go to the PTFA.

Poverty Proofing Archibald Together

Only school uniform or PE kit should be worn for clubs.

PICKUP POINT COLLECTIONS DELIVERIES DROPOFF POINT This takes away the ability to identify anyone who doesn't have the latest designer trends.

The Office will be a central point for families to drop off any donations to charity events/fundraisers such as food banks.

This means it's not possible to know who has or has not made a donation.

The Office will be a central point for the collections of school photos, cards and gifts.

This removes it being shared in class who has and who has not made an order.

Hair accessories must be plain and simple – no ears / trends / large bobbles etc This means that everyone is the same and reduces the peer pressure of the latest fashion.





Toys, swap cards and fancy keyrings on bags are to be kept at home.

This prevents those who cannot afford the latest craze or the packets of cards, and those who do not have toys at home from feeling different.

Only simple reusable water bottles should be used in school. Air Up Bottles (or any other expensive craze bottles are not permitted).

This prevents those who cannot afford the latest craze from feeling different. It stops pressure from children to grown-ups to have the 'same' or the 'best'.



School will...

Continue to cover the cost of all school visits, with the exception of the residential (50%) for children who are entitled to Free School Meals. Continue to do this discreetly by simply not adding payments to Parent Pay.

Continue to cover the cost of one school club over the academic year for each child who is entitled to Free School Meals.

This supports everyone accessing the visits/clubs and means that no-one is left behind.

Publish up and coming events with anticipated costs (where possible or as soon as possible). Ensure that visits with a higher cost can all be paid incrementally up until the due date.

This will enable families to forecast ahead for up-coming events.

Continue collecting money discreetly by having a drop box by the doors.

This prevents asking children for their donation.

We will also provide information about where to make a donation outside of school, for example, a <u>JustGiving</u> page, charity website, or text to donate number through a platform such as <u>Donr</u>. We will also remind our families that not all siblings need make a donation.

This will allow people to donate in their own way and at a time that may be more appropriate.

Whilst the 'dressing up days' have reduced; we will consider how we can adapt our non-school uniform days. We will focus on wearing uniforms back to front, inside out, adding a spotty item or encouraging home made items etc. We will also continue to highlight to children that just normal uniform is fabulous too!

This will reduce pressure on children and families for the 'right' outfit and make sure that children know that they are okay as they are.

Keep the token system at the children's Christmas fair so that all students can be given one to make a purchase.


No one will miss out on events in school or worry about not having the same as others.
