Contacting School

Strong relationships between home and school are important to us at Archibald. We value all feedback and hope that we can use it to continue to improve the school and provide the best experience for your child.

We understand that often due to work commitments it may not always be possible for you to speak to a member of staff at the beginning or end of the school day. The staff are all very approachable and would be happy to speak to you on the telephone at these times or to make a mutually convenient appointment to meet in person.



Points of Contact

In the majority of cases, the first point of contact would be your child's class teacher.

We also have three senior members of staff within the school who lead the different age phases. These are Mrs McNally for the Early Years Foundation Stage, Mrs Howard for Key Stage 1 (years 1 and 2) and Mrs Graham for Key Stage 2 (years 3 and 4).

Mrs Ward in her role as Special Educational Needs and Disability Leader is also a point of contact.

Mrs Mullick as Deputy Headteacher and Mrs Turner, as Head Teacher, are also available.

Let's get in training for this...

Can we start from now and walk & wheel to school everyday instead of for 'just two weeks'?

Walk, scoot, cycle or skate to school but leave the car behind to help our fitness and our environment.



We are working with a company called Feeding Families who provides prepacked boxes of food.

The boxes are intended to be given as an emergency provision and are intended to be for bridging the gaps in support while other long-term support is provided.

They supply boxes which would feed 2 people for 3-5 days. The boxes are filled with ambient food which does not require refrigeration and foods usually have a shelf life of a month minimum. E.g. 19 to 20 items such as UHT milk, canned goods, cereal...

If you and your family ever need a box or two (depending on the size of your family), all we ask is that you email support@archibaldfirstschool.co.uk and let us know. Or come and speak to Mrs Turner, Mrs Ward, Mrs Mullick or Mrs West.
